

If your G.T.O. has free play in the steering wheel, now is the time to correct it. Most free play is due to worn tie rods, center link, and idle arms. However, if you can turn the steering wheel and nothing happens immediately your steering gear box may need to be rebuilt.

Duties and Responsibilities of the Position of Chief Technical Advisor

Dear Steve:

I was glad to meet you at the convention. I can now put a face with the voice. As I had indicated, I am getting this letter off to you so that we can map a course for your office.

The first thing that needs to be accomplished is to get the Technical Advisory Staff fully manned and into *The Legend* so that our members can make the best possible use of their knowledge. In order to get this job off and running I propose that the first thing for you to do is to contact all (with the exception of Andy Syrkin who has resigned his post) of the currently listed (on p. 9 of the January, 1994 *The Legend*) technical advisors. You will need to find out if they are prepared to fulfill the responsibilities of their volunteer positions. Those responsibilities are:

- 1. Answer, to the best of their ability, any question posed by a member of the GTOAA as that question may apply to the year of their particular expertise.
- 2. Send a written record of all posed questions (mail & telephone) to you for inclusion in a monthly "question & answer" column in *The Legend*.
- 3. Attend the annual GTOAA International Convention to assist in the concourse judging process.
- 4. Assist in the preparation of technical articles for The Legend.

If a current advisor is not prepared to meet all of the above listed responsibilities, you should secure a suitable replacement for that year.

As I also mentioned to you at the awards ceremony, I would like you to, with the help of your technical advisors, prepare a technical article for *The Legend* dealing with detailing trunks. This article should cover such items as; trunk interior colors; standard equipment, and their various finishes; trunk mats, and correct jacking label locations for all years.

I would also like you to prepare a personal introduction to the membership of the GTOAA to be included in *The Legend* within the next two months. Please include your credentials, qualifications, and perhaps a short history of your connection with the GTO and the GTOAA.




