Building a Pontiac 421 Engine by Steve Schaeffer

In Pontiac's glory days, the 421 was their super stock/ NASCAR engine. It always had a certain mystique to it. Royal Pontiac supplied plenty of 64 to 66 GTO test cars with a little extra under the hood. They admitted years later that the Car and Driver 64 GTO had a 421 in it. The two 66 GTO Tiger race cars were also 421 powered. I just had to build one.

I have been building engines for 50 years. I have been A.S.E. certified for over 25 years. This is the first time I actually built, ran on a dyno, and drag strip tested an engine on the computer before I turned the first wrench.

I purchased Desk Top Dyno 5, #186011, an engine building program. I also purchased Desk Top Drags 5, #186401, a drag strip evaluation program. They both were less than \$50.00 each at Jegs. I also wrote a Paw Prints article on these products in the January 2010 issue if you want more information on them.

The goal was to build a strong, very streetable street/strip engine. It was also important for it to have low to mid range torque and horsepower as well as excellent mid range throttle response. I wanted a fair idle and a slight lope was ok. I also wanted enough vacuum to operate power brakes with the aid of a vacuum reserve canister. It has to have excellent drivability for street use.

With Desk Top Dyno you can evaluate many engine factors:

1. Cubic inches
2. Compression ratio
3. Valve size
4. Cylinder head air flow
5. Combustion chamber design
6. Intake manifolds
7. Carb airflow and size
8. Exhaust systems
9. Camshafts

Using Desk Top Drags you can evaluate all the variables:

1. Vehicle weight
2. Engine horsepower and torque
3. Transmissions; manual or automatic
4. Gear ratios
5. Tire sizes and types
6. Shift points
7. Weather conditions



After evaluating all of the variables on the computer I built a .060 over 421 engine. Per Desk Top Dyno 5 my 421 will produce 464 horsepower at 5,000 rpm. It will also produce 517 foot pounds of torque at 4,000 rpm.

Interesting enough this is more horsepower but less torque than all the same parts would make on a .030 over 455. The 462 makes 446 horsepower and a whopping 541 foot pounds of torque. There is not enough airflow thru my mildly reworked 71 GTO heads to support the cubic inches of a bored out 455. The 455 would need more cam and a set of aluminum heads to really come alive.

I then feed all this data into Desk Top Drags. In my all steel 4 speed 66 GTO with a weight of 3900 lbs. including driver and fuel, this engine should turn the quarter mile in 12.4 seconds. This is several tenths quicker than my current combination. Not bad for a real street car.

The final specs on my engine are:

1. 65 Pontiac 4 bolt main block bored .060 oversize.
2. 65 421 4 inch stroke crankshaft turned .020 under on the rods and mains.
3. 428 .030 oversize coated pistons. This puts the valve clearance notches in the correct location for my 71 GTO heads.
4. 58 to 62 reconditioned Pontiac forged steel connecting rods. These are safe for a 6,000 rpm shift point.
5. 71 GTO cylinder heads. 2.11 intake valves and 1.77 exhaust valves. Totally reconditioned with hardened valve seats, 3 angle valve job, minor blending, etc.
6. Final compression ratio will be 9.0 to 1. Perfect for pump gas,
7. Dual plane max-flow intake and 800 CFM carb.
8. Hooker headers.
9. Erson camshaft # E310222. A split duration cam with 284 degrees on the intakes and 296 degrees on the exhausts. At .050 the specs are 220 degrees intakes and 228 degrees on the exhaust. The lift is .472 and it is ground 4 degrees advanced for more low and midrange power.

Even at 2,000 rpm my engine will be making 448 ft. lbs. of torque. This will be a strong street/strip engine that will run perfectly on 91 octane gasoline. Fire up your computer and see what you can build.

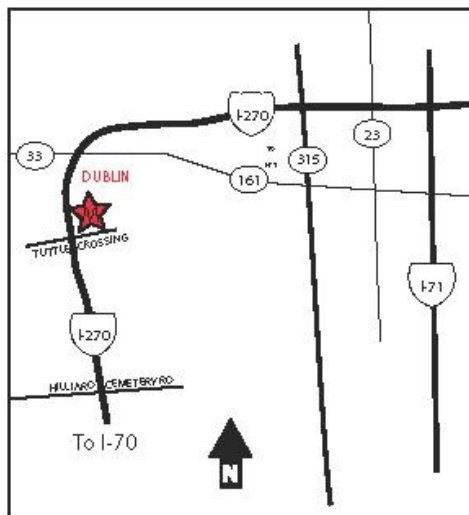

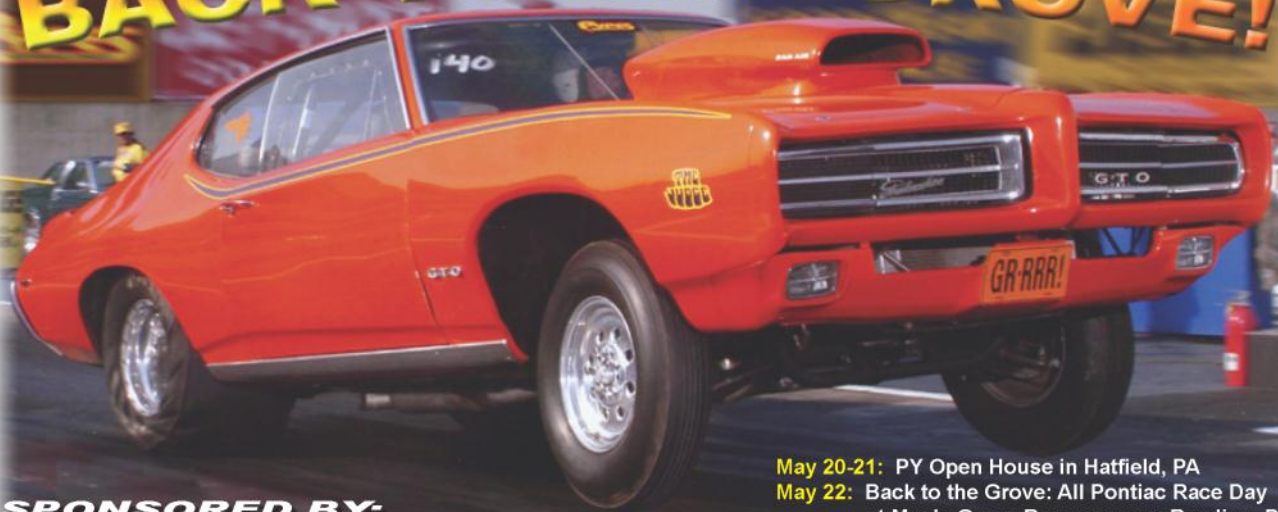

From PA Turnpike: Get on the PA Turnpike NE Extension (Rt. 476). Use Lansdale Exit 31 of the NE Extension. Make a left at the first light after the toll booths, onto Sunnyside Pike. Make another left at the 2nd traffic light (the 1st and 2nd lights are very close together) onto Forty Foot Road. Stay on Forty Foot Road until you pass the Lowes on the left. After Lowes, make a left at the next traffic light onto Clemens Road. Make the next right into building complex, we are the first building on the right.

From Route 309 North: Take 309 (or Bethlehem Pike) North past the Hatfield Wal-Mart. Make LEFT at 2nd light - Unionville Pike (LUKE OIL on corner). You will go over RR tracks, road bends to left and make second RIGHT onto Broad Street. (Look for signs for Pa Turnpike). Go to 3rd traffic light and make right onto Clemens Road. From Route 309 South: Take 309 (or Bethlehem Pike) South past the Souderton exit. Make next RIGHT at light bottom of hill - Unionville Pike (LUKE OIL on corner). You will go over RR tracks, road bends to left and make second RIGHT onto Broad Street. (Look for signs for Pa Turnpike). Go to 3rd traffic light and make right onto Clemens Road. Make next right into building complex, we are the first building on the right.

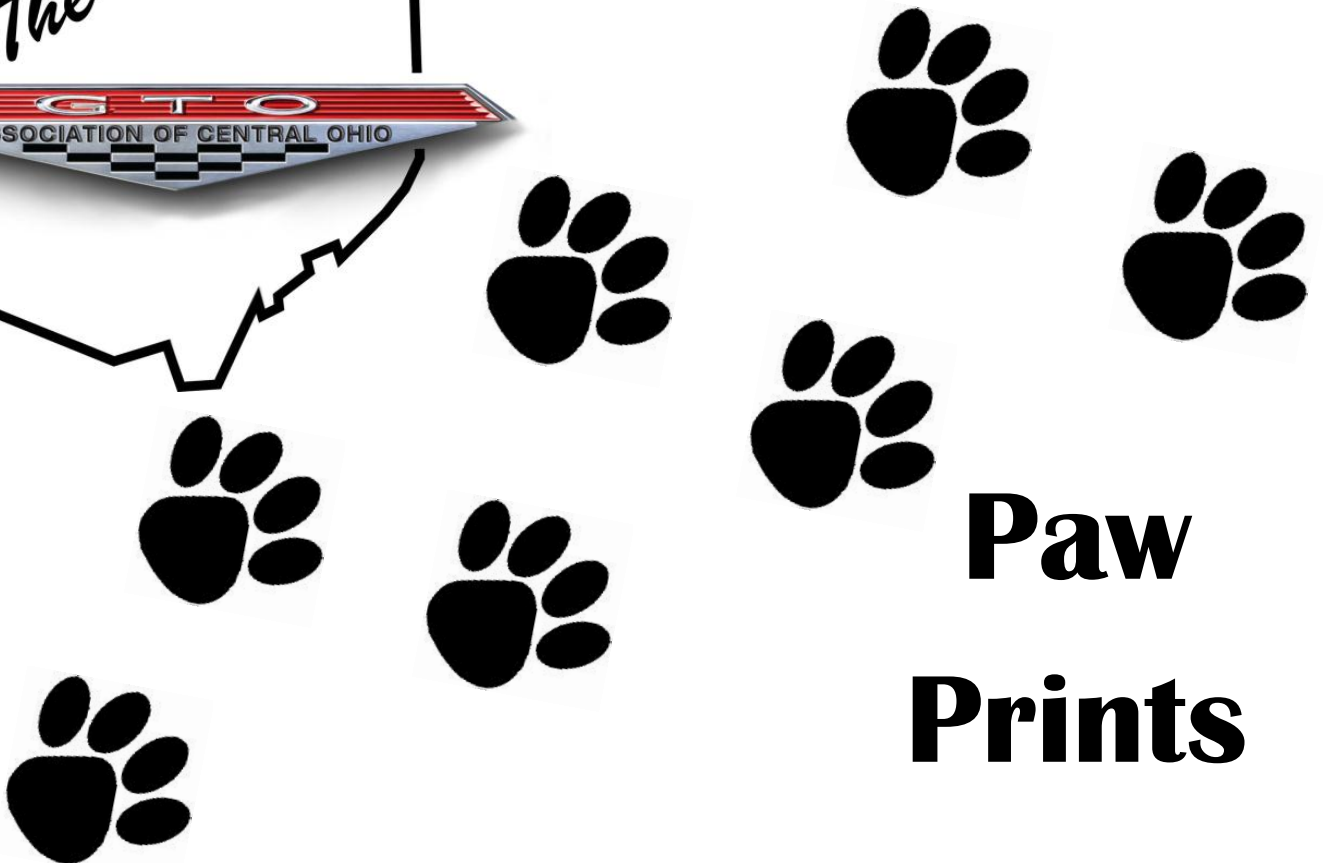
