Pontiac/Edelbrock Cylinder Head Adventure by Steve Schaeffer

It started innocently enough. A little bench racing. What are you planning for 2012? Maybe a blower or a set of aluminum cylinder heads? A GMC 6-71 supercharger has great eye and ear appeal but it also consumes a lot of horsepower and the added horsepower builds more heat in the engine adding to summer time engine cooling problems.

A set of aluminum cylinder heads have a lot of advantages. They are much lighter than the cast iron heads. Getting that weight off the front end helps improve the handling of the car. Hot Rod Magazine installed a set of Edelbrock heads on a 73 Pontiac 400 engine with the normal modifications (cam, intake, headers, ignition) and picked up 100 horsepower on the dyno over the stock 4x heads.

Jim Hands' research on a flow bench reveals that most all Pontiac "D" port heads flow 208CFM at .500 valve lift. The general rule of thumb is to double the CFM of the intake flow and that is the horsepower potential of the engine. A 4x or 6x stock head is limited to 416 horsepower.

The Edelbrock "D" port head flows 250 CFM as cast at .500 valve lift. Using the same rule of thumb we are now looking at a street engine of 500 horsepower. The Edelbrock round port head out flows the "D" port but the Edelbrock engineers say that the "D" port is geared for the street. It has excellent low speed torque and throttle response.

The late Joe Mondello of cylinder head porting fame was a big believer in port velocity. Joe said that you can have too much port CFM. On a street car, drivability requires you to maintain the low end. Do not over cam the engine either. This is why the oval port big block Chevy heads are a better choice for the street than the rectangle port heads.

Sounds easy so far. I purchased the Edelbrock 61579 "D" port heads with the 87cc combustion chambers from Jegs. I also purchased the correct ARP bolt set and the correct Edelbrock gasket set. I am installing them on my 65 Pontiac 4-bolt main block. The engine is bored .060 oversize and is equipped with .030 oversize Pontiac 428 pistons. This puts the valve notches in the pistons in the correct place to clear the valves in the Edelbrock heads. The engine is equipped with a mild Erson camshaft, .472 lift and 284 degrees duration on the intakes and 296 on the exhausts. Desk Top Dyno computes 521 horsepower at 5500 RPM and peak torque of 546lb-ft at 4500 RPM. The engine is equipped with Pontiac forged steel rods instead of cast iron.

I installed the cylinder heads with the ARP bolts per Edelbrock's instruction sheet. I need two Pontiac head bolts with the stud made on top of them; one for the battery ground cable and one for the bracket that the positive battery cable and starter wires run through. The ARP bolts are slightly longer than the stock Pontiac bolts and require the use of hardened head bolt washers. The heads require 5 different head bolt lengths. The 2 Pontiac bolts I needed where almost the same length as the ARP. The ARP bolts were engaging .485 inches of thread in each bolt hole in the block. The ARP washers are 0.125 inches thick.

I purchased 2 hardened washers .075 thick. The 2 Pontiac bolts are engaging .465 inches of thread in the engine block. I called the Edelbrock tech line and was told this will work fine with no problems. Then I went to install the rocker arms and pushrods. I was told that roller rockers are required for a cam with more than .500 lift. With a mild camshaft you can use stock rockers.





Pontiac/Edelbrock Cylinder Head Adventure Continued

As it turns out, the stock Pontiac pushrods are too short. The ARP rocker studs in the heads are .1875 inches longer than stock Pontiac or big block Chevy studs. Also my poly-locks for the straight 7/16 big block rocker studs were too short. Edelbrock says, "Stock rockers MAY require longer than stock pushrods to clear the valve springs". I called the Edelbrock tech line. No one could tell me what length pushrods these heads require with a stock base circle cam. The fact that Chevy heads take a .100 longer pushrod was the only information I could get.

Jegs only has 3/8 inch pushrod length checkers in stock. Summit does have 5/16 pushrod length checkers though. Terry at Jegs did some research for me and said 9.300 pushrods would be correct. I came up with the correct pushrod length checker and had a local machine shop set the length for me. It checks out fine. Now I'm waiting on the correct special order pushrods from Comp Cam.

I also had to order ARP 300-8242 Poly-locks. My old poly-locks were I.II4 inches long with a tapered allen lock screw. The ARP poly-locks are I.209 inches long and have a flat bottomed allen head screw to better lock on the ARP rocker studs.

I plan to have the car on the road shortly. Now that the factories are back in the performance business, it takes 500 plus horsepower just to stay with the program.

Post Script:

The questions came up: How do I know my valve train geometry was incorrect? How do I know the longer pushrod corrected the problem?

With the stock length pushrod the rocker arm was only contacting the edge of the valve stem. You could see day light between the bottom of the rocker arm and the top of the valve stem.

You cannot see it in the close up picture below of the adjustable pushrod length checker, rocker arm, and poly lock, but the bottom of the rocker arm is now centered on the top of the valve stem. Also you can see why I needed the longer ARP poly-locks. The allen screw that locks the adjustment is only engaging two threads in the top of the old poly-lock.

Edelbrock should be able to tell you that you need different pushrods and poly-locks and what size fits what. I am sure they have tested and sold plenty of these heads already.


