Cam Selection For Your High Performance Machine

Only you can decide what cam to purchase for your street driven high performance car. Check out the lift, duration and overlap specs. Use the cam duration at .050 lift as a basis of comparison between manufacturers. Read the ads carefully. A cam with a "good" idle will work fine with a stock converter and power brakes. A cam with a "fair" idle means it will sound healthy but still have enough vacuum at idle to operate power brakes. You may still need a converter with a stall speed of 500 or 600 RPM over stock. Be careful with a cam advertised as having rough idle and powerful mid to upper torque. It will shake your teeth out at a traffic light. It will also require a vacuum reservoir to operate the brakes, a high stall speed converter and a low rear gear. Do not over cam your street driven car. Remember that 95% of your driving is for daily transportation.

Installation

Install your new cam with new lifters, new timing chain set and the proper assembly lube. Install the cam straight up using the factory timing gears and marks. Do not attempt to advance or retard the cam timing without first degreeing it in.

On Pontiac and Chevy V8s, use heads with screw-in studs and push-rod guide plates. Increased valve spring pressure will pull the pressed-in studs loose in the heads. Also, the push-rod guide plates prevent the push-rod holes from wearing oversize in the heads. If the guide holes wear oversize, you will start bending the push-rods.

Adjustment

You can adjust the valves on a Pontiac and Chevy V8 engine by using the following procedures:

Pontiac: Adjust the valves before installing the intake push-rod chamber cover.

Chevy: Adjust the valves before installing the intake.

Turn the crankshaft so that the number one cylinder is on top dead center and ready to fire. Then adjust exhaust 1-3-4-8 and intake 1-2-5-7. Turn the crankshaft one revolution which will bring the number six cylinder to top dead center. Adjust exhaust 2-5-6-7 and intake 3-4-6-8.

When you adjust the valves, wiggle the push-rod up and down as you take out the slack on the rocker arm nut. As soon as the push-rod doesn't wiggle up and down and before the plunger in the lifter moves away from the spring clip, STOP. This is zero lash. Now tighten the rocker arm nut a 1/2 turn. You can see the plunger in the lifter move down, away from the spring clip. This will give you the .020 to .060 lifter preload. By leaving the intake manifold off, you can see the lifter preload. You will not adjust the valves too loose or too tight. With the distributor installed correctly, the engine will start right up.

Breaking in your cam

During the first 1/2 hour of operation with your new cam, keep the engine RPM over 1500 RPM. Do not allow the engine to idle. The new cam and lifters require plenty of oil to break in properly. All the parts have to get friendly with one another.

After the first 100 miles of driving, change your oil and oil filter. Now you can enjoy your new cam. Listen to the sound of power as you idle through the drive through. Feel the new horsepower perform on the highways. But remember, when you really want to run it through the gears, take it to National Trails Raceway or Pacemaker's Park—it will be easier on your driver's license and your insurance premium.

Note: Valve adjustment is for all Chevrolet and Pontiacs which have been converted to screw-in studs without shoulder.


