6T9 GTO from Trans Am Depot by Kevin Russo

Discovery Channel's American Chopper had become pretty old for me. Once Paul Jr and Sr split up and OCC started making less custom choppers and more production looking bikes, honestly, I lost interest and the show was canceled. Then this year, Discovery announced American Chopper: Jr vs. Sr. The show claimed that Paul Jr's binding contract on how long he had to wait to start a bike shop was over and he was going head to head with his father. Like most reality TV loving Americans, I wanted to see how the fight and lawsuits would end up, but I also wanted to see Paul Jr's newest creations. He was the design and creativity master!

So as I sat down one evening for my latest dose of the show when, low and behold, Paul Sr's OCC got a job to create three custom choppers to match three custom cars being built by Trans Am Depot. The 7T7 Trans Am was designed honoring the 1977 Pontiac Trans Am. The 6T9 Trans Am was designed honoring the 1969 Pontiac Trans Am. But the one that got my motor running was the 6T9 Goat; designed honoring the 1969 Pontiac GTO Judge. All were designed by Kevin Morgan and built on top of the new Chevy Camaro platform but with custom parts doing the honoring of it's respective model. While I thought the bikes were Ok, the cars knocked my socks off!

Don't get me wrong, The Trans Ams are nice but the 6T9 Goat is the beauty! Trans Am Depot plans to introduce production kits to change your current generation Camaro into one of these beauties. 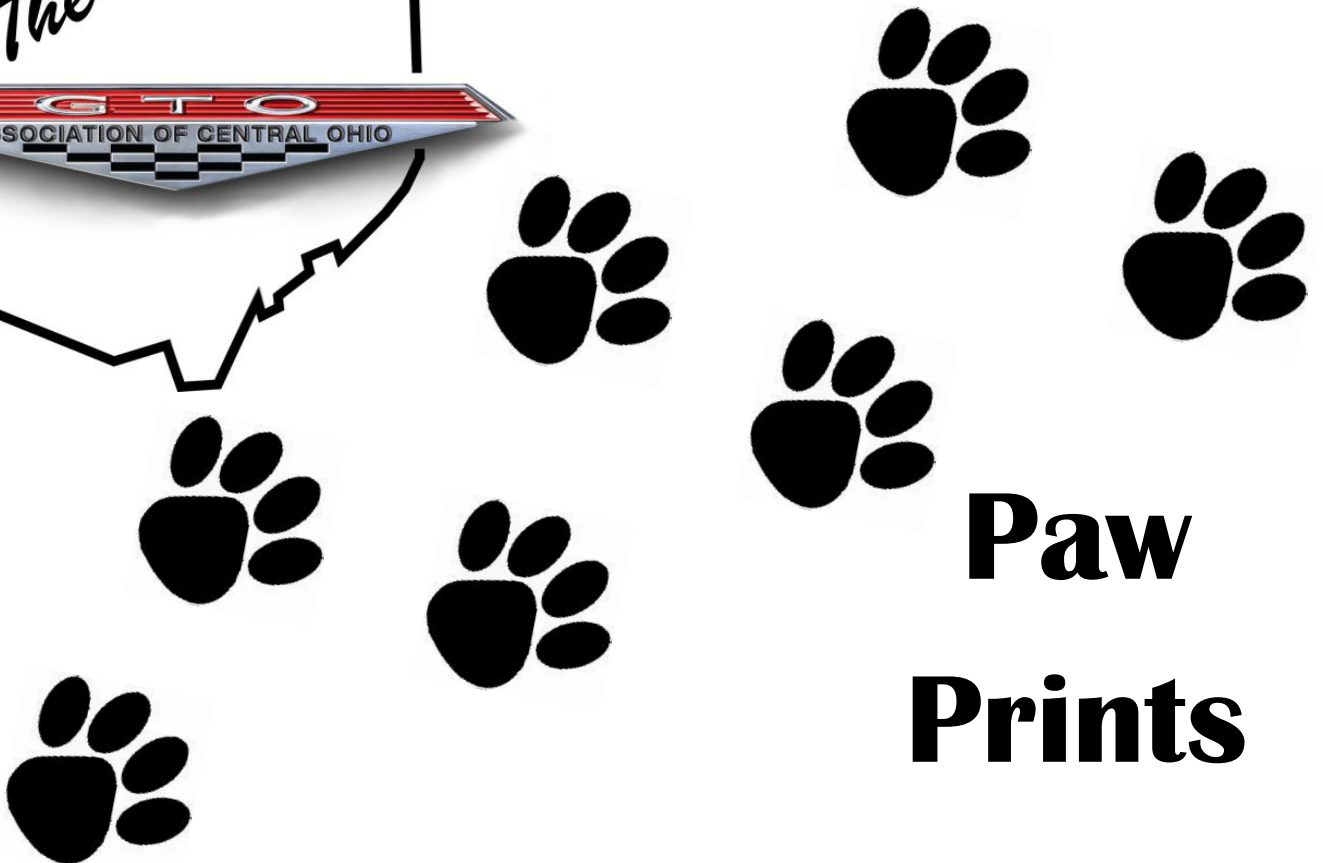
