It was really cold but it was also very rainy the days leading up to the show. So for the second time since I have been attending this show, it was moved off the Sunbury Square. In 2011, it was moved to Sunbury High School. Several club members showed up for breakfast at the Sunbury Grill before we headed over to the high school to try and stay warm.

In total, we had over 14 member cars there.

# 64 Pontiac LeMans H.O. By Steve Schaeffer

Pontiac's Fogotten Muscle Car; owned and resotred by Steve Schaeffer.

In 1964 the top of the line Pontiac performance car was supposed to be the Tempest LeMans H.O. (High Output).

Packing a 280 Horsepower, 326 cubic inch engine, with a Carter AFB 4 barrel, dual exhaust, and demanding premium fuel, this car was to be a runner. Then Pontiac snuck out the GTO thru the back door, and the H.O. became Pontiac's forgotten muscle car.

While the value guides have forgotten the H.O. this is really a very rare car. Pontiac built 32,450 GTOs in 1964. They only built 4,819 H.O.s with standard shift transmissions. This number includes both 4speeds and 3speeds.

I found mine in Ann Arbor, Mich. It was a totally stripped out shell from Santa Monica, Calif. It was dressed as a GTO. When the former owner got the news from PHS that it was born as an H.O. he lost interest in it. It was a 326 H.O., factory 4speed, with dual exhaust, and 15 other options.

I already own 3 GTOs that I restored over a period of years and had a large accumulation of spare parts. This seemed like the perfect project car because I already owned almost everything this car was missing. Even though I eventually replaced both quarter panels it was a very solid car. The frame, cowl, doors, floor, and trunk floor were rust free. I bought the car in May of '06.

I put it up on 4 stands in the garage and pulled it apart. I was driving my "Rat Rod" LeMans by the end of the summer. I cleaned and painted everything. The first thing I did was completely replace the brake system from bumper to bumper. I also had to replace both front spindles and rebuild the front end. The manual steering gear box was rebuilt by Steer and Gear in Columbus, Ohio.

I put a '68 GTO 3.55 posi rear end under it with new springs, air lift air bags, boxed control arms and a rear sway bar. I later upgraded the rear end to a 12 bolt with 3.42 gears, a new Eaton POSI unit, and Moser forged axles.

I had the engine sitting on the shelf. I rebuilt it in my home garage. All the machine shop work was done by Scott Murray in Lancaster, Ohio. It is a fresh 455 with 6x heads, Lunati cam, 230 degrees duration at .050 and .490 lift. One of my friends gave me a set of Summit headers that he had replaced off his car with a set of big tube Doug's.





### 64 Pontiac LeMans H.O. continued By Steve Schaeffer

The transmission is a wide ratio Muncie 4 speed that I also rebuilt at home. I just had to send it out for the press work to the local machine shop.

When I say this car was a stripped out shell, I even had to replace the ignition switch and the horns. The under dash wiring harness was there, but I had to purchase a new engine harness and headlight harness.

I also already had tires and wheels. I put 215-65-15 on the front on Pontiac 15x7 Rally II wheels. The rears are 275-60-15 on Pontiac Rally II 15x8 wheels. The rear wheels have 5 inches of back spacing.

I drove the car in primer and had a great time with it. I didn't have to worry about rock chips or door dings.

The interior was really rotten from the Calif sun. I purchased a complete interior kit from Ames. I took the car over to Rod at R&L Upholstery in Lancaster, Ohio. He had previously done Tom Hamilton's Gold winning '67 GTO. He did a beautiful job.

Then I learned that The GTO Nationals were going to be in Columbus, Ohio in 2007. When I learned that there was going to be a class for modified A and X bodies, I took the vise grip off my wallet. I took the car to Dencer Auto Body in Lancaster, Ohio. Richard had it in the paint jail all winter. He painted it with DuPont F7999K Bright Silver, Code PS2. I had the bumpers re-chromed and all the moldings polished. I kept the car a LeMans and did not clone it in to a GTO despite pressure from a few of my friends. We did put a '64 GTO hood on the car because it did not look right without hood scoops.

To make a long story short, I won 1st Place at the 2007 GTO Nationals. Since then I have added manual disc brakes with a dual master cylinder for safety. I did this because we drove to the Ames Tri-Power Nationals in Norwalk, Ohio. I came home in the rain with the 4 wheel manual drum brakes. I felt I was putting my foot thru the firewall and the car wasn't stopping. Disc brakes are a must so you can stop as short as a modern car from speed. I also replaced my Q-Jet carb and cast iron intake with a pair of Edelbrock 500cfm carbs on a P65 Edelbrock aluminum intake. I also dressed up the engine with a set of finned aluminum valve covers from Pacific Performance. I also need to thank John and Chad at B&J Garage in Lancaster, Ohio for all there help on this project. It's not the Great One, but this is


