# 2019 GTOACO Spring Club Cruise By Stan Farlow

The GTO Association of Central Ohio is an official GTO Association of America chapter. Our club's goal every year is to kick off the car season with an all Pontiac Swap Meet in March followed by a spring cruise in late April. We always have a good time at both events regardless of the weather April can bring at times in Ohio. In April of 2019, we were blessed with good planning, a good route, and cool sunny weather. Most people think of Ohio as either the flat plains of the northwest or the bluffs over the Ohio River Valley. Some car magazine readers have read articles about road tests that use a well-known route in the Hocking Hills. Central and Southeastern Ohio has many miles of winding 2 lane roads along ridges and valleys that will have you believing that you are no longer in Ohio. This year was our first time on the top of the ridges of state routes 519 and 250 around Adena and Martins Ferry, Ohio. A few club members drove their new generation GTOs, another a Firehawk, and a couple of other cars but the older 68, 67 and 70 GTOs and a LeMans owned the day with 60 degree air and winding roads through the hills.

Normally we sort out a good route that leads us to a good restaurant (or winery) with maybe a stop or two at roadside attractions. This year we were fortunate to be hosted by Butch and Liz Miller who brought along Judge Frank A. Fregiato (the same Judge Frank Fregiato who writes the Quarter Mile with the Judge articles in the Legend). We all met for lunch at the Farm Restaurant in Adena Ohio. The Farm Restaurant is on top of a hill far enough out that we had an escort the last few miles to help find it. Far out but well worth the trip to visit this great restaurant.

At the restaurant, we were met by a news team from WRTF from Wheeling, WV for interviews and an evening news story. Club VP Brian D'Amico had quite a bit of time on the Wheeling, WV evening news. Judge Fregiato made an eye opening presentation about activities being promoted by local car clubs to fight the drug problem in Ohio. I always look forward to the Judges articles in the Legend. I didn't know that he presides over the drug court portion of the Belmont County Common Pleas Court.









# 2019 GTOACO Spring Club Cruise continued







Drug court is a voluntary path for eligible non-violent drug offenders who seek rehabilitation and want an alternative to prison sentences. It is a boot camp style program designed to rehabilitate drug offenders and teach accountability. An example of a drug court accountability practice is the 20, 30, 40 plan. All offenders are required to obtain and keep a job. When an offender states that they are unable to find employment, the requirement is that they perform 20 hours community service per week. If the offender continues to be unable to obtain employment they are required to perform 30 hours per week of community service. It's easy to guess where this is going. It turns out that most offenders, when faced with a full time job doing community service, are able to find some kind of paying job.

I took a bunch of notes during the Judges presentation. In doing some additional research I found this article from the May 2, 2019 issue of the St. Clairsville, OH newspaper "The Times Leader" <a href="http://www.timesleaderonline.com/news/local-news/2018/05/drug-court-no-easy-road-to-rehabilitation/">http://www.timesleaderonline.com/news/local-news/2018/05/drug-court-no-easy-road-to-rehabilitation/</a>. It turns out the Judge's efforts have been recognized in the US Senate and were the inspiration for legislation jointly introduced by Ohio and West Virginia Senators (Looks like this is no ordinary county drug court).

Judge Fregiato's attempts to implement existing and develop new practices that improve the courts' outcomes led to the conclusion that the only way to be completely effective was to stop people from entering the drug culture in the first place. Further, it was decided that intervention needed to begin in elementary school and even kindergarten in both public and private schools. To raise funds for the school programs, the "Belmont County Schools Staying Clean Car-Bike-Truck Show Festival" was created. Through extensive use of sponsors, the show has raised over \$63,000 for 2019 and the show isn't until September 14. Local schools are also involved in the planning and conduct of the show. The Belmont Career Center students are making the trophies out of used car parts.

The message is that car clubs can make a contribution to their communities.

After lunch and that overwhelming presentation, we proceeded to Butch and Liz Millers "mancave" in Martins Ferry, OH. We had an escort involving several police cars and lots of lightsnot a problem in your windshield but this many lights would be terrifying in your back window. The Millers purchased a building that had been an old time car dealership and turned it into a man-cave with space to work on cars. The garage was well stocked with Pontiacs. Butch's comment was that every car had a personal story -like the 66 GTO that he sold new, bought back, and restored. The documentation includes all the original dealer related information that most of us could never obtain. Then there is the legendary 1965 GTO station wagon from Canada complete with tri-pwr and close ratio 4 spd. Not limited to GTOs there were 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> gen Trans Ams and a couple of 1956s with restoration in the planning phase. Fieros were well represented with a rare 1988 Formula with T-Tops and two very low mileage GTs. Also, there were enumerable die cast cars, go carts, and signs from years past. All in all this is a very nice collection of Pontiacs in a facility that left us all more than a little envious.

As usual the best part of the day was the social interaction between our clubs members and with our incredibly cordial hosts. I always feel good when we can have 30 people together for a day with no drama and everyone having a good time. We certainly want to say Thank-You to Judge

Fregiato who took several hours from his busy schedule spend the afternoon with us. Finally, we are indebted to Butch and Liz Miller for their help in planning, arranging for the restaurant and police escorts, and last for opening their wonderful facility for us to visit.

I hope you enjoyed our story as much as we enjoyed sharing it. After nationals, our club will be working on our 2 summer shows and planning to hit the road again this fall.


