t's no secret that the 6th Annual Battle of the Brands Car Show was a huge success this past July. With well over 240 cars registered, this was the largest this event has ever been! To celebrate that fact we'd like to share just one more "branded" story.

As I write this piece and as many of you know, I actually own two brands. Of course, I own my 1968 Pontiac GTO, but I also own a 1969 Dodge Charger R/T 440. At times, these two brands do battle, but not for me.

I acquired my Mopar in 2004. Since I was 14 years old, I was in love with this car. It is my dream car, and I am so lucky and happy to have it. There is no price that can buy this car from me. I had watched prices over the years, and noted how much MORE money I didn't have, in hopes of one day owning one. When doing that in August of 2004, I came across an ad for this car. It was in Delaware, Ohio and in fact, less than 5 miles from my home. I reached out to the owner to take a look at it with a co-worker who was well versed in '69 Chargers. While I still did not have the asking price money, I decided to take a look and, if it made sense, offer what I had for the car. The car was in good shape. It needed a little TLC,

especially in the trunk where it was pretty rotted due to a back-light leak, but otherwise was rust free. It was a numbers matching original drive train. In fact, the car was all original except for a repaint and seat upholstery which had to be replaced due to a little winter live-in visitor one year. Additionally, it was 100% complete! Even the vinyl taillight covers in the trunk were there! I offered what cash I had for the car and as expected, the owner didn't take that offer. I left without my dream car but with the offer remaining on the table and for him to call if anything should change. Two months passed and at the end of October 2004, I got a phone call, it was the owner! He said that he was tired of people trying to scam him and that he felt I would do good by the car and not just flip it, so he sold it to me for my offer and I got my dream car! Since then, I have restored the emblems, repaired and restored the Magnum 500 wheels, and replaced the trunk pan.

What many of you may not know is that I owned a Ford product when I first encountered this club. I owned a 1970 Mercury Cougar with a Houndstooth matching top and interior! I knew Ron Cozzo and had recently met









Mike Shockley, Jim Evans, and Jeff Frazier of the club. Despite not having a GTO or even a Pontiac, these folks were wonderful, and we all became fast and longtime friends. Ron even helped me restore and partially rebuild the 351 Cleveland in my Cougar. When it came time to part with that car, my time with my friends from the GTOACO had stirred the dormant Pontiac man in my soul. My first experience in a Pontiac was back when I was young. My Uncle Gerald had a 1975 Pontiac Grand Prix with 400 CI V8 that was a monster! I can remember being thrust into the back seat whenever my uncle matted that accelerator! Despite that experience, I wanted a GTO, a 1968 GTO to be specific. A friend of mine found my car at the Springfield Swap Meet in 2008. The owner was in Greenville, Ohio, a stone's throw from the Ohio/Indiana border. Ron Cozzo, Jeff Frazier and I went out there to see the car. It had

Frazier and I went out there to see the car. It had a Pontiac drive train of a 400 CI V8 and a TH350 out of a 1976 big car Pontiac. The original engine block had been destroyed during a race. It was painted Buccaneer Red with a black interior. The PHS told me that the car was originally a Meridian

Turquoise hard top with a turquoise interior and an 8 track. Once again, I made an offer and went home without a car. The owner wanted to try and sell it for his asking price at Goodguys that year. Once again, the owner called me back after Goodguys, we made a deal, and I became the happy owner! Ron helped me get the car home with his trailer by meeting the now previous owner in Springfield to get it. The 2009 Nationals was the first GTOAA/POCI Co-Vention in Dayton, Ohio. There I found a 1968 GTO 400 with 60k miles on it running on a stand. It was cast within 3 months of my cars build date. I acquired that engine (a story for another day), did a

refresh of gaskets and timing chain/gears with the help of Ron Cozzo and dropped it into the car. The car won second place in the popular vote class of Stock GTOs at the 2013 GTOAA/POCI Co-Vention in Dayton! After a mishap (again another story for another day), I had the car repainted to its original Meridian Turquoise. What a great decision that was because I love it!

So, you see, there really is no brand battle for me. If you know me, you know me, you that I'm just a car guy. I love all classic muscle cars. I love my Pontiac, I love my Mopar, and I hope to own an Oldsmobile one day, a 1968 442 to be specific. Sure, I have preferences, but I appreciate all the hard work, blood, sweat, tears, and money that everyone puts into their beautiful cars. But I do have the most fun with my Pontiac!
